THE GOSPEL READING FOR 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

4 December 2022

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew chapter 3: verses 1 - 12

Glory to you, O Lord

In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the wilderness of Judea ² and saying, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.' ³ This is he who was spoken of through the prophet Isaiah:

'A voice of one calling in the wilderness, "Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him."

⁴ John's clothes were made of camel's hair, and he had a leather belt round his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵ People went out to him from Jerusalem and all Judea and the whole region of the Jordan. ⁶ Confessing their sins, they were baptised by him in the River Jordan.

⁷ But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to where he was baptising, he said to them: 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the coming wrath? ⁸ Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. ⁹ And do not think you can say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our father." I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. ¹⁰ The axe has been laid to the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹ 'I baptise you with water for repentance. But after me comes one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹² His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing-floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire.'

This festive season, the cost of living crisis is hitting hard and putting many vulnerable people at risk of food poverty and homelessness. Local people are facing difficult choices, but DENS is here to help.

We help people like Chloe, whose life was in crisis. Her desperate situation was turned around after she received a food parcel to feed herself and her mother. We help people like Harry, whose life was saved once he worked with our Outreach team to find safe and warm accommodation to get him off the streets.



Chloe was forced to flee her home with her elderly mother in order to escape a violent ex-partner.

With finances stretched to the limit due to rocketing energy bills, Chloe turned to the Foodbank.

Chloe says thank you for saving her life "from being desperate to knowing there's somewhere that will take care of us." Harry was found asleep on a park bench, alone and vulnerable.

With expert advice from the Outreach team, Harry has now found accommodation, away from the cold and lonely streets.

Harry says thank you for saving his life by getting him off the streets and helping him access the vital support he needed.
